

TOWN OF PARADISE SEWER PROJECT

Since 1979, the Town of Paradise has been working to find a solution for wastewater in commercial and dense residential areas where groundwater could be harmed, and business growth is slow. In January 2025, the Town began looking at building a local system to collect, treat, and safely release wastewater—with help and ideas from the community. The plan is being designed to match today's building costs and available funding. This way, we can start with a smaller project soon and grow it over time to serve more of Paradise in the future.

PROJECT BENEFITS

The Paradise Sewer Project will bring benefits to the Town and region:



Provide wastewater disposal surety to help businesses and jobs return to Paradise, and spur on recovery



Allow for more densely-populated residential development in the Town to help increase affordable housing



Improve Paradise groundwater quality by decreasing septic tank discharges



Create a wastewater solution supported by the CVRWQCB and Town Council
